Message From Shadow Dur Shelter Mascott

i everyone ... it's me, Shadow – the PAWS Shelter Mascott ... perhaps we've met if you've visited us in either Toronto or Huntsville. My Mom (Kim – the President of PAWS and my very best pal in this world) is really busy with the other animals in the shelter right now and with helping to organize the Anniversary Celebration so I thought I'd help by writing my own message this time, where the 'Presidents Message' normally appears.

I met my Mom and her/our family back in February of 1993 - it's hard to believe that was more than 15 years ago - they 'adopted' me on Valentines Day after losing their first German Shepherd, Princess to hip dysplasia at the tender young age of 7. I'm the only animal here at PAWS who was not rescued. I'm a very lucky dog - I was never mistreated or abandoned - I've been loved and cherished my whole life. Not all animals are that lucky I've learned. So many have called out to my Mom and the other PAWS Volunteers for help and we've answered. I've helped the best I could too. Many of the cats who have come into our care were afraid of me or of my human pals at first but in time - they learned to trust (some of them trusted me before my human friends ... I'm still working on Toffee). They realized that we loved them and many have been adopted by special families who continue to care for and love them, thankfully. However, many remain in our foster homes and shelters in Toronto and Huntsville. Just the other day I heard my Mom say that we have 130 kitties in our care - can you even imagine what a commitment that is and how expensive it is just to provide food and cat litter never mind veterinary care and shelter?

To give you an idea what we're up against, major issues we've been faced with since our last issue of PAW Print ... my long-standing pal Buddy came close to losing his life to his heart condition - thanks to Dr.'s Mike (Toronto) and Melody (Bracebridge) his medications were changed and he's doing very well, my little friend Emma has been re-diagnosed with diabetes, Sunny had a bad ear infection that wouldn't go away, Millie came down with a terribly bad cold, Tom is battling kidney failure, our FIV (feline aids) and FeLuk (feline leukemia) cats require 'depo' shots - some on a monthly basis as apparently their immune systems are not as strong as the others. As you know, not one of the animals PAWS has rescued goes without treatment when it's required and Mom insists on dealing only with the very best Veterinarians in Ontario. We've learned that they are not all created equally.

In July of 2007 we moved many of the animals to Huntsville and, of course, I too live here now. We were really excited – but a little scared too 'cause it was a big change for everyone involved. What most of you don't know is that the day we moved, we received a letter from one of the main veterinary clinics that we trust. We had just experienced the worst, most expensive and emotionally-draining Spring ever with the loss of many cats whom



we loved. We tried everything to save them – but some sadly did not survive their illnesses. This was very expensive and the clinic, rightfully, was expecting payment. We owed a whopping \$45,000!! Amazingly, we have managed to raise funds totaling close to \$30,000 and our bill stands at about \$15,000 – our goal is to at least retire this debt (with your help!) via this issue of PAW Print and our 36th Anniversary Celebration in September.

In honor of all of the years my Mom, her Parents (Hella and John), all of the PAWS Volunteers and I have dedicated – I ask you to please give generously in response to this plea. Also, come on out and fondly remember our past and celebrate our future on September 12th. Thank you!

On Thursday, August 7th I thought Shadow had suffered a stroke. She was suddenly unable to rise, to stand or to walk. I have been providing nursing care to her since as it's believed that she has Idiopathic Vestibular Disease (IVD – compared to Vertigo in humans) and dogs CAN recover from this illness. Shadow will be 16 in December and in spite of a long, healthy life she has been dealing with Degenerative Myelopathy for the last few years which I have been controlling with various medications (Metacam/Vit. E/Glucosamine/Missing Link Plus). Please take a moment today to close your eyes and hope along with my Family, PAWS Volunteers and I that Shadow will recover. I'm not ready to lose my most loyal companion and friend and I will stop at NOTHING to get her back on her feet again.
